



## TR REGISTER (NEW ZEALAND) INC.

### Concours d'Elegance Competition – National Weekend (V3.0.1 Dec 2017)

#### **RULES**

##### **Standard Class, Modified Class and Masters Class**

1. A car may only be entered by a member of the TR Register (NZ) Inc., an affiliated Triumph club or an invited Club. Only private individuals may enter.
2. Entries into these competitions will be taken at the Friday registration and will close at 9am on Saturday.
3. Advertising, either on or by the car, is limited to a single sheet of paper or sticker no larger than 100mm by 180mm.
4. All costs incurred by the entrant will be paid by him/herself.
5. The organisers cannot accept any liability for loss, damage or injury to the vehicle, entrant or passengers.
6. Classes. Entrants are eligible for judging in one class, either Standard or Modified Classes. The previous year's class winners are eligible for the Masters Class only.

##### **Standard Class**

- TR2, 3, 3A & Derivatives including Doretti
- TR4, 4A, 5 250 & Derivatives
- TR6
- TR7, 8

##### **Modified Class**

- TR2, 3, 3A & Derivatives including Doretti
- TR4, 4A, 5, 250 & Derivatives
- TR6
- TR7, 8 and Derivatives

##### **Masters Class**

- Winners of the previous years Standard & Modified Classes of each body type. (One competition for all TR models)
7. A minimum of 2 cars is required per class. Classes may be amalgamated or divided depending on numbers of entries.
  8. Factory standard (original) or freshly rebuilt cars are encouraged to enter the Standard Class competition.
  9. A car must receive a minimum of half of the total available marks to be awarded a trophy or medallion.
  10. The winners must undertake to have the trophy, awarded to them, engraved in the same manner as the existing engraving and return such trophies to the Concours Manager of the event prior to the following year's Concours, in the same condition and cleanliness as received. If a Concours is not held the following year, then winners are to return the trophies to the TR Register President by the end of that calendar year.
  11. Cars must be road worthy, licensed and have a current WOF.

12. Entered cars must be in position at the time of judging commencement.

13. It is intended that entered cars must be driven to the event; under normal circumstances it is not permissible for a car to be trailered for all or part of the journey to this competition. Evidence of a car being trailered from its normal place of storage for any part of its journey to the Concours may result in disqualification or other penalty. Any car that is not driven to the event may NOT be accepted for entry or otherwise penalised.

14. Awards:

- Each entrant receives a Participation certificate.
- Each successful entrant receives a medallion ( Rule 9 above applies)
- Trophies will be awarded to the winners of each class body type.

15. The Judges decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
